Enhanced Nutrition and Health for Upland Phoukoud Phase II (ENHUP II)

OVERALL OBJECTIVE

ENHUP II's primary objective is to contribute to the overall socio-economic development and poverty alleviation of Lao PDR through health and nutrition-specific and nutrition-sensitive interventions for 11,224 household members, particularly women of reproductive age (WRA) and children under 5 years (CU5) in Phoukoud District, Xiengkhouang Province.

Timeframe: October 2020 - August 2023

Target: 16 villages in Phoukoud District, Xiengkhouang Province

Donors: Canadian Foodgrains Bank / ADRA Canada

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

Nutrition

Reduce acute and chronic malnutrition and underweight for WRA and CU5 through anthropometric measurement and growth monitoring visits, rehabilitation programs, outreach home care visits, community awareness and reproductive health sessions.

Agriculture

Increase access to clean home-produced vegetables and protein for pregnant and lactating women and malnourished CU5.

Community-led total sanitation (CLTs)

Increase knowledge of and adoption of key disease prevention/treatment practices to reduce malnutrition and support household-led construction of latrines with the aim of declaring open-defecation free communities.

Capacity Building

Improve awareness and capacity of implementing partners to adopt best practice, multi-sectoral approaches to nutrition and share learnings via nutrition platforms.
